DISTRICT NAMES PRINCIPAL TO LEAD NEW EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER



Confirmation that Olmsted Falls Intermediate School will be ready for the 2009-2010 school year allowed District officials to also move forward with plans to transition the existing Fitch Intermediate building into the new Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center. Parents of pre-k and kindergarten students were notified by letter in late June about the plan to begin classes at the Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center facility for the start of the coming school year. While this creates an extremely tight timeline, it was determined that it was best to eliminate a mid-year transition for these young "Bulldogs," and be able to provide all primary grade levels with much needed space. Coverage of this new facility has been handled without the hiring of an additional administrator, or of any additional front office or custodial staff.

The Olmsted Falls Board of Education voted unanimously at its June Board meeting to approve the hiring of Ms. Gina Sanfilippo as the new principal at the Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center which is estimated to serve approximately 150 students in each of its a.m. and p.m. sessions (300 students total). Ms. Sanfilippo will also continue to serve in her role as assistant principal at Falls-Lenox Primary School, where enrollment is projected to be approximately 850 students. Ms. Sanfilippo has been with Olmsted Falls Schools since 1993, when she joined the District as a 4th grade teacher. She has been part of the District's administrative team since taking the assistant principal position at Falls-Lenox in 2003.

Current District administrator Ms. Gina Sanfilippo will serve Olmsted Falls Schools in a dual capacity as the new principal of the Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center as well as continue as Assistant Principal at Falls-Lenox Primary School.

"We are pleased to have Ms. Sanfilippo take the helm at our new Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center," said Superintendent Dr. Todd Hoadley. "She brings with her a solid background of both administrative and classroom teaching experience at the primary level that will be a great asset to our children as we build this new early childhood educational community."

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ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES

New students enrolling for the first time, either as new residents or as kindergartners, should follow the procedures below. Note: all kindergarten students are considered new students.

- 1. Please contact the building where each student plans to enroll to arrange for an appointment. (See contact information listed for each building located on back cover.)
- 2. Only parents, legal custodians and/or legal guardians can register students in the district.
- 3. If moving in from another district, do not forget to sign a release form from your previous district.
- 4. Items needed at time of enrollment:
 - Student's Birth Certificate
 - Student's Social Security Number
 - Student's Immunization Records
 - **Proof of District Residency** (One of the following: tax bill, mortgage coupon, gas, electric or sewer/water bill, or a signed rental agreement.)
 - **Proof of Custody** (Certified copy of court order, if applicable.)
 - Driver's License or Picture Identification
 - Most recent report card

To expedite your enrollment process, registration packets may be picked up at the Board of Education Office Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Packets contain detailed registration information for each building along with Olmsted Falls City Schools Registration Form, Release Form for Information from Previous District, and Home Language Survey. You may also visit the District's website at **www.ofcs.net** to download these forms in advance of your scheduled appointment. Forms are the same for all four buildings.

EARLY ENTRANCE NOTICE

Children must be five years old **by August 1st** to enroll for Kindergarten classes in Olmsted Falls School District. The District is frequently contacted with questions regarding early entrance of children into Kindergarten. According to Ohio Administrative Code, if a child does not turn age 5 by the District cut-off date (August 1st) but turns 5 by January 1st, the parent may request that the child be tested for possible placement in Kindergarten. Children who do not meet the mandatory cut-off date (August 1st) cannot be admitted into Kindergarten unless they meet the criteria for early admission pursuant with the District's adopted Acceleration Policy for Advanced Learners. The standards, which have been established by the District for the purpose of early admittance, emphasize skills and characteristics which correlate with success in an academically oriented program. The evaluation is designed to identify those children who are functioning at a superior level in all developmental areas including intelligence, academic readiness, social/emotional maturity, verbal abilities and physical development. discuss appropriateness of early entrance into kindergarten for an individual child, please contact Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center Principal Gina Sanfilippo at 427-6360 or gsanfilippo@ofcs.net or Director of Student Services Merritt Waters at 427-6140 or mwaters@ofcs.net.



IMPORTANT NOTICE: STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The Olmsted Falls School District designates the following items as "Directory Information:" a student's name; address; telephone number; date and place of birth; major field of study; participation in officially-recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; dates of attendance; date of graduation; awards received; honor rolls; or scholarships. Parents and/or eligible students have ten (10) days after receipt of this public notice to view the student's "Directory Information" and to provide notice in writing to the school district that they choose not to have this information released. Unless notified to the contrary in writing within the ten (10) school-day period, the school may disclose any of these items designated as "Directory Information" without prior written consent. Directory information shall not be provided to any organization for profit-making purposes. The Board shall not permit the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information (or otherwise providing that information to others for that purpose).

IMMUNIZATION RESTRICTIONS

A student is not permitted to remain in school for more than 14 days, unless written evidence is presented to school officials that the student has been immunized by a method approved by the Ohio Department of Health. Students must be immunized against poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, and measles, or be in the process of being so immunized. Ohio Immunization Law requires that all children present written evidence of immunity to mumps and rubella. If you have a question about this policy, or feel you have a reason why your child should not be immunized, please contact your building principal.

MEDICATION POLICY

A reminder to parents regarding the Medication Policy for all buildings:

- <u>All</u> medication must be brought to school by a parent or responsible adult. Medications cannot be transported to school on the bus.
- Medication Forms can be downloaded from the school website or obtained from the school office.
- A Medication Form MUST accompany ALL medications before they can be administered. Prescription medications require <u>both</u> a physician and parent signature; over-thecounter medications require only a parent signature.
- All medication must be in its original container.

District-Wide Late Start Days Replaced by Additional Staff Development Day for 2009-2010 School Year

In lieu of the four traditional District-wide Late Start days, one additional staff development day has been added to the 2009-2010 school year. A special waiver made available to school districts by the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) allowed Olmsted Falls Schools to apply for the additional non-student day to be used for staff development. The ODE officially granted the waiver to Olmsted Falls School District in mid-July, at which point the determination was made to eliminate the District-wide Late Start days and replace them with the additional staff development day (November 13th).

CHILD FIND NOTICE

School districts across the State participate in an effort to identify, locate and evaluate all children from birth through 21 years of age who may have disabilities. Disability, in this instance, means such conditions as hearing or visual impairments, speech or language impairments, learning or behavioral disabilities, multiple disabilities, other health impairments, physical impairments, autism and traumatic brain injury.

A referral may be initiated by parents or agencies knowledgeable of the child's needs. Upon receipt of a referral, Olmsted Falls City Schools will seek further information about the child using a variety of possible sources such as interviews, screening and testing to determine whether the child qualifies for special education services. All information will be held in strict confidence and released only with parental permission or as required by law. GIFTED IDENTIFICATION NOTICE

The Olmsted Falls City Schools gifted identification plan identifies students in the areas of superior cognitive ability, specific academic ability, creative thinking ability, and visual and/or performing arts ability. The identification process consists of three phases: referral, screening and assessment.

Specific criteria for identification are used for each area. A teacher or parent may refer children for identification by completing and submitting the application form, available at each building, during the first week in September or the first week in March. EZpay SYSTEM AVAILABLE FOR 2009-2010


Based on positive response from parents, the Olmsted Falls School District will continue to make the EZpay online system available for the payment of school meals and school fees for the 2009-2010 school year.


FALLS-LENOX PRIMARY SCHOOL TRAFFIC PATTERN



If you plan to drop off or pick up your child from Falls-Lenox Primary School, please refer to the map (at left) and the following procedure to facilitate a safe and orderly process.

- No parking is permitted in the oval area during our bus arrival (7:30 8:05 a.m.) and dismissal (2:00 2:45 p.m.) times.
- During the remainder of the school day, parking in the oval area is permitted, but only in the designated parking spaces. Please be aware of the handicap parking spaces, and please do not park along the curb.
- In our Drop-Off/Pick-Up area, stopping and remaining in your car is permitted. Move with traffic and pick up or drop off in the area indicated on the map.
- Parking in the area indicated on the map is permitted. After parking, parents must proceed to the Drop-off/Pick-up area to get their child.
- Picking up students in the parking lot is not permitted. Thank you.

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL TRAFFIC PATTERN



If you plan to drop off or pick up your child from the new Olmsted Falls Intermediate School, please refer to the map (at left) for traffic flow, and note the following procedures to help facilitate a safe and orderly process:

- Enter at the driveway leading back to the Olmsted Falls Intermediate School facility (located east of the entrance to the Middle School). Please note that Olmsted Falls Intermediate School and Middle School each have their own separate entrance drives; the drives/parking areas for the two facilities do NOT connect.
- The flow of parent traffic for drop off is indicated with white arrows on the map. The designated drop off area is located in front of the main entry to the school. Move with traffic to drop off your child(ren) along the curb in front of the main entrance as indicated on the map.
- Parents wishing to pick up their children after school, or at any time during the school day, must park and come to the main office to sign their child(ren) out. Picking up students from the curb or in the parking lot is NOT permitted.
- Visitor parking is located in the area indicated on the map. Please be aware of the handicap parking spaces, and please do not park along the curb.

PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TRANSPORTATION

Those parents or guardians of students in grades K through 8 who reside in Olmsted Falls School District but attend a chartered Ohio non-public elementary or secondary school that we do not provide transportation to may be eligible for reimbursement for transportation. The school of attendance must be 30 minutes or less traveling time via school bus from the Olmsted Falls school that the student would normally attend. Travel time is calculated from portal-to-portal at the time the bus would normally transport a student to school in the morning.

If you feel that you may qualify for Payment in Lieu of Transportation, please submit your reimbursement request in writing by Thursday, October 1, 2009 to the Board of Education, Attn: Office of the Treasurer, P.O. Box 38010, Olmsted Falls, Ohio, 44138.

BUS INFORMATION MAILED IN AUGUST

In mid-August, parents of registered students in grades K to 8 will receive a bus stop information postcard notifying them of their child's specific bus stop pick-up and drop-off location. Please remember to review your child's bus stop location carefully as adjustments to routing have been made this year as part of the *Educational Reduction Plan*.

A complete list of all District bus routes, stops and times will also be available in mid-August on the District's web site, **www.ofcs.net**, under the Bus Routes link. If you have not received a bus stop card as of August 17th, or if you have any questions, please contact the Transportation Department at 427-6350.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Implementation of the *Educational Reduction Plan* as it relates to transportation services for the 2009-2010 school year at Olmsted Falls Schools has been completed. Please remember that:

- There will be **NO HIGH SCHOOL BUSING** for public or non-public students for the 2009-2010 school year, except for those busing services required by law (individual IEP requirements and Polaris Career Center transports).
- The deadline for Alternate Transportation Request Forms was June 15th. No late requests will be accepted without proof of a change in residency.

NEW TRANSFER PROCEDURES

All students attending Olmsted Falls Intermediate School, Falls-Lenox Primary School, Olmsted Falls Early Childhood Center, St. Adalbert, St. Mary of the Falls, and St. Richard School will ride the same bus in the morning to Falls-Lenox Primary School. Falls-Lenox Primary School will act as the hub for students to get on their assigned transfer buses to the appropriate school.

Students attending **Bethel Christian School** will be transferred from Olmsted Falls High School to Bethel Christian School on transfer Bus #40 in the morning. Bus #63 will pick up Bethel Christian students and return them home in the p.m. Students attending **St. Mary of Berea** and **Messiah Lutheran School** will ride the appropriate bus to Olmsted Falls Middle School and then transfer on their assigned transfer bus to the corresponding school.

PLEASE REFER TO THE FOLLOWING SCHEDULE TO FIND YOUR ASSIGNED TRANSFER BUS:

OLMSTED FALLS EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER TRANSFER BUSES

All buses will arrive at Falls-Lenox and students attending the Early Childhood Center should use the following procedure to transfer:

In the AM, Early Childhood Center students should ride the first available transfer bus - either #74 or #77 - to the Early Childhood Center

In the PM, Early Childhood Center students should ride their ASSIGNED transfer bus as follows:

Bus #74 will transfer students from Bus #43, #62, #65, #67, #68, #71, #72, #73, #74 and any students transferring to Kids First.

Bus #77 will transfer students from Bus #75, #76, #77, #78, #82, #83, #84, #85, #86, and #88.

Note: Parents of special education preschool students will be personally notified regarding transportation arrangements for their students. (Bus transportation is not provided for preschool typical peer students.)

OLMSTED FALLS INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL TRANSFER BUSES

All buses will arrive at Falls-Lenox and students attending the Intermediate School should use the following procedure to transfer:

In the AM, Intermediate School students should ride the first available transfer bus - either #67, #68, #70, #71 or #78 - to the Intermediate School.

In the PM, Intermediate School students should ride their ASSIGNED transfer bus as follows:

Bus #67 will transfer students from Bus #66, #67, #83 and #84. Bus #68 will transfer students from Bus #68, #77, #79 and #82. Bus #70 will transfer students from Bus #70, #76, #80 and #88.

Bus #71 will transfer students from Bus #65, #71 and #75.

Bus #78 will transfer students from Bus #43, #78, #81 and #87. Bus #85 will transfer students from Bus #62, #72, #74 and #85.

Bus #86 will transfer students from Bus #73, #86 and Intermediate School students transferring to the Olmsted Community Center after school program.

SPECIAL RIDERSHIP INSTRUCTIONS for Grade K to 8 Non-Public Students:

**Attention all Non-Public students: Transportation will not be provided for early dismissals from non-public schools. Other arrangements should be made for pick up on these days. On days when Olmsted Falls schools are <u>not</u> in session, but non-public schools are, <u>transfer buses</u> will run as normal. Students will need to be at the public school site to board the transfer bus before the assigned departure time.

MESSIAH LUTHERAN

In the AM, Messiah Lutheran students will ride to OF Middle School on their assigned bus and transfer to Messiah Lutheran on Bus #40 in the am. Bus #40 will pick up Messiah Lutheran students in the PM and take them home.

ST. ADALBERT TRANSFER

In the AM, St. Adalbert students will ride to Falls-Lenox and transfer on Bus #66 to St. Adalbert. Bus #66 will also transfer these students back to Falls-Lenox in the PM and they will ride home on their assigned primary route bus.

ST. MARY OF BEREA TRANSFER

In the AM, St. Mary of Berea students will ride to OF Middle School on their assigned bus and transfer to St. Mary's on Bus #62 in the AM. In the PM, these students will get picked up at St. Mary's by Bus #63 and #65 and taken home. Please refer to your postcard for your assigned bus numbers.

ST. MARY OF THE FALLS TRANSFERS

All buses will arrive at Falls-Lenox and students attending St. Mary of the Falls School should use the following procedure to transfer:

In the AM, St. Mary's students should ride the first available transfer bus - either #65 or #80.

In the PM, St. Mary's students should ride their ASSIGNED transfer bus as follows:

Bus #65 will transfer all students riding Bus #'s 43-79 Bus #80 will transfer all students riding Bus #'s 80-88

ST. RICHARD TRANSFER

In the AM, St. Richard students will arrive at Falls-Lenox and will transfer to St. Richard School on Bus #62. Bus #5 will pick up St. Richard students and take them home in the PM.
