Observations from an Empty Nest

My nest is empty this fall. Both of my children- yes, they are technically adults, but I haven't fully accepted that yet- are away at school. I'm now firmly on the "other side" of parenting, and it's not nearly as fun- or as awful- as I thought it would be. I've made a few observations over the past few weeks, and since I'm counting this as my talk therapy, you get to read them. (Thanks for "listening"!)

Back to School hits differently. You're not worried about the bus schedule, or the start and end times of school. (Unless you're trying to avoid the unavoidable Bagley Road traffic snarl.) You don't care about finding the purple pocket folder with prongs on the supply list, or what required summer reading your kid didn't do until RIGHT NOW. You don't need to go on a recon mission to get intel about your child's teacher. There's no shopping for "school shoes", or Pinterest-ing healthy lunch ideas for your kids to throw away. It's great! And it's not. While I'm happy for less to do this time of year, I don't have less to worry about. Which leads me to...

Bigger decisions with bigger consequences. Daily parental decision-making is exhausting. It's a labor-intensive, emotional roller-coaster guiding your precious angels on the path from infancy to 18. If you love your kids, and you are making the best decisions with the information you have, then you are succeeding.

Suddenly decisions like which preschool to send them to or whether or not to move them to a toddler bed seem like not such a big deal.

The extra space feels empty, and I'm in no rush to fill it. I've thought about this many times as I've looked upon two empty (mostly clean) bedrooms that used to house my girls. There are still tattered stuffed animals, paperback books, high school memorabilia, and in my youngest daughter's case, the bearded dragon that we are now caring for because she isn't considered an "emotional support lizard" and therefore isn't a dorm-friendly pet. The space is extra now, but I have no plans to do anything with it anytime soon. I hope they'll still want to come home, at least for the next few years, and right now I plan to leave things alone. Let's not call it a shrine. It's more like a "Teenage History Museum". Entry is free, but may cost a couple of tears.

This is what we wanted. Right? From the time our kids are born until they leave the nest, we are preparing them to eventually live their lives as adults. Perhaps that happens when they graduate high school and start a new job, enter the military, or head to college. While some have special needs or challenges and may not ever physically "leave" us, we strive to set them up to succeed in any way they are able. In the end, you get what you were supposed to want all along- for them to contribute to the world and find their own way. I say "supposed" to want, because there have been many days when all I want is to be pushing them in a stroller, waiting for them to get off the bus, cheering them on from the sidelines, even listening to them practice their saxophone (really!)

If your nest is still full, I hope you will enjoy it and embrace the day-to-day stuff with your children, including the good and not so good. As parents, our work is never done, empty nest or not. Perhaps you will have a lizard to take care of long after they go and the nest won't be so empty after all. I've got one you can borrow if you get lonely.
