Reports from the Regular Meeting/Work Session of May 7, 2009 and Regular Meeting of May 21, 2009

# Regular Meeting/Work Session - May 7, 2009

The Board toured the construction site of the new intermediate school, then met at the offices of the Board of Education and began the Work Session. They heard a report by the treasurer and then made some decisions:

- 1. The District will not place a levy on the ballot in August 2009
- 2. Supplemental contacts will be awarded for the upcoming fall and winter athletic seasons.
- 3. Spring athletics will be made at a later date.
- 4. Attorney Kondzer will send a letter to advise the Cuyahoga County Board of Revision that if we have not filed a counter-complaint, it does not mean that we agree with the requested decrease.

# Regular Meeting - May 21, 2009

- 1. **Administrative Reports** 
  - A. **Hullman** provided the financial report for the period ending April 30, 2009; the financial bank reconciliations; analysis of the new intermediate school project; 5-year forecast analysis and discussed the May 2009 5-year forecast; and asked the Board to adopt resolutions concerning the certification of amounts and rates as certified by the County Auditor and a resolution pertaining to Workers' Compensation group rating program; and asked the Board to approve a "Now and Then" exhibit concerning vendors "Art to Remember" and "Scholastic Book Fairs."
  - B. **Mr. Lewis** reported that the Insurance Committee met on May 18 and reviewed the health insurance proposals one of which will be recommended to the Board at the May 21 meeting; reported that negotiations will begin on Tuesday May 19 with exchange of proposals and continue on May 21 and May 22 and later, if necessary; will be working, along with Dr. Lloyd, on principal evaluations; met with Mr. Hullman to discuss reductions to the five-year forecast; met with secretarial staff on the EZPay procedure sharing updates and changes to the procedures; and met with NEOLA representative Joe Siegferth to continue to review NEOLA policy and guideline updates.
  - C. **Dr. Lloyd** provided a progress report on the implementation of the District's Continuous Improvement Plan; and mentioned that the District Leadership Team has been asked to present at the Ohio Leadership Advisory Council's Summit in Columbus on June 16<sup>th</sup> (Olmsted Falls was 1 of 4 districts asked to make a presentation.)
  - D. Mr. Atkinson Transportation: met with principals Svec, Roseberry and Sanfilippo to discuss school start and end times for the 2009-10 school year which will be the same as our current schedule; stated that the Community Transportation Informational Meeting was held on Saturday May 9<sup>th</sup> was well attended, and seemed to be successful in terms of disseminating information and answering questions concerning the transportation policy to be implemented during the 2009-10 school year including a new Alternate Transportation Form; Buildings and Grounds: reported that we will apply for a \$1.3 million grant to supply emergency generator power for the Red Cross approved shelters at our Falls-Lenox and High Schools; met with the head custodians and Gardiner—Trane to discuss our views of the completed HB 264 project and their overall service; had many other meetings including: (1) a keying meeting for the new Intermediate School; (2) meeting with AVG mechanical engineer and testing company to determine the adequacy of our current Middle School boiler pumps in relation to the new Middle School

additions and whether they will handle the additional load; (3) a meeting with 3 moving companies for the move to the new Intermediate School; and (4) attended construction progress meetings as well as our monthly Core Team meeting; requested quotes for the cost of enclosing our High School stadium visitor bleachers on the sides and aisles and seating areas in order to satisfy Jarod's Law requirements and the Cuyahoga County Board of Health inspector – openings cannot exist where 4" is exceeded; Fitch baseball fields have been upgraded by the Community Summer League program; and a public meeting is going to be held June 10, 2009 at the Middle School regarding the Stearns Road railroad grade separation project; **Personnel**: driver meeting was held and the route selection process began May 21; appraisals are "in process"; we had the last OAPSE labor/management meeting for the 2008-09 school year; 36 preliminary summer staff letters have gone out. We will revise the summer salary schedule to reflect a reduction in the adult salary rate and the elimination of the differential rate for bus garage workers – student rates will remain the same; and reported that High School night security began Friday, May 15 and will continue through Sunday, May 31.

E. **Dr. Hoadley** – updated the Board of Education on the status of Level A and Level B cuts on the Educational Reduction Plan; and reported that the Board and OFEA are working jointly through negotiations.
